"If your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here." Exodus 33:15

I love the heart of Moses in that moment, his audacity and persistence, but mainly his overwhelming desire for what really matters.

The Lord God had had enough. The children of Israel had been murmuring and complaining from the beginning; they refused to enter into His Presence when invited to the Mountain of God, and—with a final insult—they molded that golden calf to replace His Magnificent Presence with a despicable image. As a result, God told Moses, "Go up to the land flowing with milk and honey (the promised land) but I will not go with you."

If we were in that position, what would we choose? What if God said to you and I, "Go, have all I have ever promised you, everything you have ever prayed for or dreamed of, but I will not go, My Presence will not be with you." What would we choose? Would we go? Sadly I believe most of the church today has gone and doesn't even realize that He is not with us. And even more tragically, most people in the church are okay with the absence of the Presence of God, as long as they get what they want; the blessings, the provision, the security and some sort of religious significance. I believe that if it wasn't for the heart and leadership of Moses, the children of Israel would have taken God up on His offer; they would have gone alone to the promised land and ultimately to their destruction.

But Moses knew what really mattered. He knew that it wasn't the promised land with all its abundance and security. It wasn't the satisfaction of seeing the arduous journey come to an end and victory over their enemies. What really mattered to Moses was to know his God as He knew him. That's why Moses said, "If You will not go, then we will not go." And, after hearing God answer favorably, he pressed his luck and asked his God further, "Please, show me Your Glory." And Brothers and Sisters, God answered him in a mighty, unique, and awesome way.

Everything we do here at the Re*Creation Center, we hope is in accordance to that very pursuit, to know our God as He knows us. Whether it be Sunday morning services, Wednesday night Bible studies and Rangers, Friday night Oasis youth group, the prayer meetings, the after school program, and every other little thing we do on a daily basis, we hope and strive that the intention of our actions, the motivation of our hearts, the cry of our lips,

all who serve here at the Re*Creation Center is **Give Me Jesus!** No, we do not meet these expectations every day, and I personally fall short more than I would like to admit, but in the end, "it is He who is working in us both to will and do for His Good Pleasure." He is all we want, all we need; day after day as "we with unveiled face behold as in a mirror the Glory of the Lord, are being transformed from Glory to Glory by the Spirit of the Lord," that by that mighty miracle, the Lakota people will see and experience Jesus for themselves and then they too will cry out, **Give Me Jesus**.

We hope you know that we love and appreciate all of you. To know that you are praying and believing with us gives us the courage and fortitude we need to press on. We also hope you take courage in your own place of influence and seek after Him with all your heart because He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. Let this be your pursuit, your heart's cry, **Give Me Jesus!**

On a personal note, Ela and I would like to thank you all for your prayers and encouragement in the midst of our immigration saga. We are happy to say that we are now only two steps away in the visa process to finally putting all this distance behind us and sharing our lives together in the same zip code. Through this whole ordeal, we have been boldly proclaiming that we are not waiting on the government or bureaucracy but we wait on the Lord and with that He has kept His promise to renew our strength and He is bringing us the Victory.
