Moreover, just two weeks ago we celebrated as one big family in our third Unity Gathering this year. We have seen men and women come to faith in Christ as the Spirit has drawn them into the Arms of their Father by the Blood of Jesus. And we have experienced the Person of Holy Spirit as we have grown in our understanding of who He is and what we are to Him. Our God is Good!

But there have also been several shootings and violent deaths across the reservation as the influence of drugs increases and the despair among the youth prevails. The people are grieving, and we grieve with them. But in the midst of the turmoil and heartache, our God is Faithful as He takes what is in the darkness and drags it into His Marvelous Light; the enemy can no longer hide in the shadows. We are seeing evidence of this Divine Illumination every day as our God shines the Brilliant Light of Christ into our communities, our homes and the people we love. And as fear and despair were no doubt the objective of the enemy with these tragedies, the Holy Spirit has instead used them to cause us to turn to one another in unity and brotherly love and to lift our voices together as we Cry Out in true desperation! We are praying with the words of King Asa when faced with an unbeatable army standing against him and the nation of Judah, "LORD, it is nothing for You to help, whether with many or with those who have no power; help us, O LORD our God, for we rest on You, and in Your name we go against this multitude. O LORD, You are our God; do not let man prevail against You!" 2 Chronicles 14:11

CHURCH FAMILY NEWS We were blessed to baptize and welcome a new member into our church family. Lewis and his family have been living with us for a while and God used that time to speak


Jesus and understanding of the Word of God!
