

Back in September after Mary's Wednesday night Bible Study, two teenage boys who had attended her class that night came back after getting drunk and broke into the Rec Center. They proceeded to steal a brand new computer that a wonderful supporter had bought us and an X-Box 1 the kids use in the Rec gym.



They also raided our concession stash and cleared most of the snacks and pop. The next day I called the cops and filed a report, but to the best of my knowledge nothing happened. We heard rumors about the stolen laptop and tried to locate it to get it back but nothing came of it. After this, both teens avoided us for months, even running from me one time I pulled into the local gas station to get fuel. So you can imagine Eric and my surprise when both teens came to us about a month ago, apologized, and asked if they could come back to the Rec. We prayed and thought about it and decided on a plan: each teen would have to do 50 hours of work around the Rec and also meet with me for 30 minutes a day for a bible study. The teens agreed, and I specifically focused on what the Bible teaches about being a man. We also watched the movie "Courageous" together.

All in all, I believe that their work service and the study sessions were an impactful eye opening experience for the two young men. In fact, this Tuesday as I met with them for Bible study I felt let to give them an impassionate and anointed gospel presentation. When I was finished, both of the teens decided to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. The moment we began praying together the atmosphere in the room changed and the presence of God could be felt. Afterwards both teens said they felt a tingling sensation go down their spine when we prayed and I didn't even lay hands on them. There is no doubt what happened in that room was real and these young men are now brothers in the Lord and family. Now it's time to be a disciple. Hallelujah!
