One day, Jesus got into a boat and told His disciples, "Let us cross over to the other side." Jesus, weary from ministry and travel, fell fast asleep as the disciples sailed those familiar waters. Then a strong storm arose, such a storm that it had seasoned fisherman afraid for their lives. All the while, Jesus kept sleeping. Finally, fear got the best of them. They wake Jesus up in a panic; Jesus rolls over, rebukes the storm, and all is calm. Then He turns to His wet, anxious disciples and asks them the question, "Where is your faith?" Had they forgotten his words, "Let us cross over?" And if He said it, wasn't it a done deal?

I believe that Jesus only dealt with the storm for the sake of His disciples. I believe He would've kept on sleeping because for Him, whether it stormed or not, they were getting to the other side. He had an appointment with a legion to set one of His beloved free, and nothing was going to hinder that encounter. More importantly, had they forgotten Who He was, Who was in the boat with them? Did they really think a mere storm, even if demonically contrived, could unravel the plans of God and sink His Beloved Son? By asking "Where is your faith?", Jesus was saying to them: You're in the boat with Me, and I said we will get to the other side—that should be enough.

We as a Church recently studied this passage as we have been working our way through Luke, and I could not help but see some parallels in our present day circumstances. No doubt, in almost all areas of our society, a storm is raging. Like that day on the lake with Jesus and the boys, it seems that this storm is demonically driven, bringing us to a demonic encounter to set people free, all of it ordained and orchestrated by the mercies and providence of God. But whatever your eschatological views are, I believe we can all agree that there is a disturbance in the air, and it's getting scary. The question is:

Are we in the boat with Jesus?

We are blessed as His Church, His Family in Oglala to be in the boat with Him. I could give testimony after testimony of peace, joy and rest in the midst of utter chaos and turmoil, and it's all because of Who we belong to and His promise that we will get to the other side. We are also blessed to have Oyate Hope Academy join us in this boat with Jesus. In the Fall, Oyate Hope moved into our building and the transition has been so smooth and positive that we must give God all the Glory!

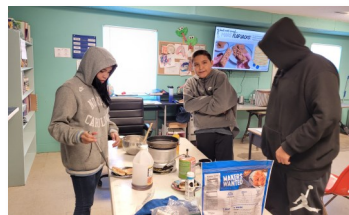


OYATE HOPE ACADEMY

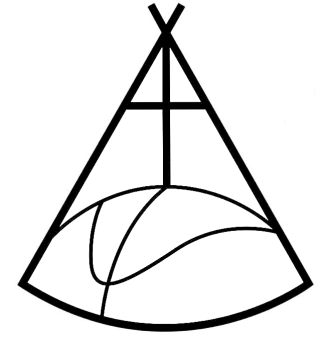
CHURCH FAMILY NEWS
