I recently spoke at a local men's retreat. The message for that weekend was that we are to be 'men distinguished by His Presence.' In Exodus 33, after the incident of the golden calf, God told the Hebrew people to go on to the promised land and that He would send an Angel before them, but He would not go with



them because of their stubborn pride. The people rightly took this as bad news and grieved. Moses heard this same bad news and stopped. No way would he take another step without his God, because Moses knew something the others did not. He knew that the Promised Land was empty without Yahweh God. He knew the Promise was only as good as the Promiser and He refused to have the one without the Other. That's why Moses told God bluntly and passionately, "If Your Presence does not go with us, do not lead us up from here for without Your Presence. How else will we be distinguished among the nations?" Moses knew that the true Treasure, the real Prize at the end of their journey, was not a piece of land but the One who created that land. He knew that it wasn't their culture, history, religion, laws or ceremonies that would distinguish them and set them apart from the world. Instead, it was His Presence, God with them that marked them as His Beloved, His own special people.

How did Moses know this? Well, a curious event took place in the midst of this terrible ordeal. It says that after hearing this bad news, Moses took his tent outside of the camp and invited God to meet with him (Exodus 33:7). Understand that this is before the official Tent of Meeting had been built; that comes later. This is Moses's personal tent, his home, his place of rest. This is the tent he took his meals in, slept in, rested from his everyday toils, etc. Moses decided he needed to get away from the hustle of everyday life (outside the camp), take his own personal space and then invite the King of Glory into his own home. Before this, God had done the inviting. At the burning bush, on top of the mountain, it was God who had invited Moses in. But now, in this moment, Moses does the inviting. And what's amazing is that God answered this invite with a YES! How crazy is that? In this tent, Moses's personal space, outside the camp, God met with Moses and spoke to Him Face to face as a man speaks with his friend. And it was in this encounter with his God where Moses told Him, "I'm not going anywhere without you," and even pushed boldly, almost recklessly forward and asked God, "Show me your Glory!" Even this request was granted, and after God showed up, Moses eventually came back to the people with his face shining with the Glory of God, physically distinguished by His Presence.

We must be a Church that is distinguished by His Presence, a church known as "those who have been with Jesus." As the western church, we are known for so many other things; our leadership, our preaching, our music, our kids programs, our politics and—sadly—our scandals. But what if we were known as the people of God, the place where God is, distinguished by His Presence? What if we were willing to forsake the "promised lands" in our lives and instead make the Promiser our prize, our ambition, our treasure? What if we made ministering to Him priority over ministering to others? What would happen if we got outside the camp (the busyness of life) and invited Him into our private space and did not leave until He showed up? He did promise that if we drew near to Him that He would draw near to us, right?

Oglala, the Laketa people with whom we interact in our everyday lives, in our school, the Rec gym, the jail and various other ministries don't need any more of us. But they do need Jesus, the Presence of the Ever Living One! We are supposed to be the Temple of the Living God, filled with His Presence, His Spirit, and when they see us, they should see Jesus. So that means we need to privately and collectively get outside the camp and invite Him in. Set time aside daily on our own and together with the Family of God to seek His Face in prayer and worship. And as we minister unto Him, He in turn ministers to us and makes it possible for us to minister to others as we walk and live as people of His Presence, as those who have been with Jesus.


CHURCH FAMILY NEWS
